The Lakeshore Light Opera has raised \$136,000 for the purchase of medical equipment for the Lakeshore General Hospital (LGH) Foundation since they first decided to donate proceeds from their annual shows over twenty years ago.

The proceeds from the Lakeshore Light Opera's 2010 production of "Iolanthe" helped to acquire two syringe-pushers for newborns in the Maternity Ward of the LGH. We thank the Lakeshore Light Opera for their many years of support.

THE NEW LGH ER: Healing with Dignity

The reputation of a hospital centres largely on its ER, as it is the department that has the most interaction with the community surrounding it. The Lakeshore General Hospital is no exception.

Between April 2009 and March 2010, over 43,000 people visited the LGH's emergency ward. Amazingly, this facility was built for a population of 90,000 in 1965, and has not been substantially reconfigured since; in that time, the population has grown to nearly 400,000. In other words, the ward is ripe for change to reflect the growth, diversity and evolving demographics of the communities surrounding the hospital itself.

Dr. Tomas Kaufman, Chief of the ER and Co-Director of Outpatient Services for the West Island HSSC, has seen many outward changes in the 22 years he has attended to the needs of emergency patients.

"I have seen a tremendous transformation over this time in equipment, organization, medication, procedures, and above all, patient demographics," he noted in a recent interview. "The ER of 1965 opened with rotary telephones. When I came to the ER, cell phones were the size of toaster ovens. Today, there are portable ultrasound machines that are smaller."

He also witnessed the introduction of triage to the ER, the computerization of the laboratory, new scanning equipment, the introduction of the internet and of online imaging, in which images can now be transmitted across the city, or even around the world for a diagnostic opinion.

However, these advancements have not affected the physical state of the ER itself.

"The LGH ER is a 24-year-old temporary structure," Dr. Kaufman observed. "It has no proper foundation, has a leaky roof, drafty windows, and poor ventilation." He added that the space is not 'green' - meaning that it leaks heat in winter, and cold in the summer - and sanitary facilities such as showers and toilets are lacking. Most crucially, the ward has an illogical layout and ergonomics, with inadequate isolation areas, resuscitation beds, and equipment.

The ER is seeing a growing but aging population come into its doors, which means that there are far more complicated cases requiring increased treatment times. The situation is exacerbated by the critical shortage of Family MDs in Quebec, and many find themselves dispatched to the ER due to delays or outpatient investigation.

The LGH ER is the third busiest ER in Montreal - far busier than the Royal Victoria or the Montreal General hospitals - but only has a fraction of the beds compared to the downtown institutions. "Simply put," Dr. Kaufman noted, "we are a very busy ER with a diminished ability to offload our patients." This, he mentioned, is the reason that the admitted patients stay far longer in the overcrowded ER.

Despite the difficult conditions, the ER staff manages to keep the ward running, and are treating patients in the best way that they

continued from page 1 possibly could. "It is a tribute to our staff that despite this extrinsic gross impediment to our ability to do our jobs," he said, "the work still gets done remarkably well." He emphasized that "the LGH staff is our most valuable commodity and asset."

The situation can improve with the support of the community. "I would like to see a modern, well-equipped functional ER that is designed to heal with dignity," he stated.

The new ER would improve care by improving such crucial aspects such as patient privacy and facilities, patient mobilization, ergonomics, increased specialized areas such as isolation, resuscitation, psychiatry, and paediatrics. A major component of reconfiguring would involve the modernization and increasing of equipment, such as CT scanners, in the ER, for which our Foundation will play a large part.

"These changes would result in an improved, dignified healing environment, but will also improve staff morale, retention, and recruitment," Dr. Kaufman added.

To facilitate these improvements, Dr. Kaufman and the ER staff need your support. The changes that they would like to see require money - and the government needs to be shown that the community is united and committed. "The LGH ER needs urgent revamping," Dr. Kaufman affirmed. "Our patients and staff deserve this...and the time is now."

VOLUNTEER SPOTLIGHT

The LGH Auxiliary

Ever wonder who the men and women in the hospital wearing the light blue coats are? They are seen frequently around the hospital, selling books, pushing carts chock full of items for the comfort of patients, and in the Windmill café and gift shop, among many other activities. All of these individuals form the Lakeshore General Hospital Auxiliary, which is a volunteer organization dedicated to assisting with hospital services and with improvements to the hospital.

The auxiliary was formed in 1962, three years prior to the opening of the Lakeshore General Hospital. The group was formed to help to acquire medical equipment that the government has not purchased, and to strive for better medical and patient care. Fundraising is conducted through yearly events such as a bazaar, gift basket raffles, and other events. Consequently, auxiliary funds pay for wheelchairs, equipment for

the operating room, and even taxi tickets for the dropping off of patients at home after medical treatment. In addition, members offer a hands-on approach, with volunteers assisting with the day-to-day operations of the hospital.

"So many [auxiliary members] work so hard to sell books, serve coffee, etc." said Sally Brown, past president of the auxiliary, in a recent interview.

On the fundraising side, the auxiliary has worked in conjunction with the foundation for many major projects. Last year, both organizations helped to refurbish the waiting room in the ER.

"We wanted to see something of comfort to patients by having nice chairs and an environment to wait, because we know that the patients are nervous," she observed.

The 'auxiliaries' work hard year-round to fundraise for major projects. Volunteer fundraising allowed

the auxiliary to donate \$122,500 for the LGH Foundation's Tools for Healing campaign, to help to build the new Ambulatory Care Centre, approximately ten years ago. The auxiliary also shows philanthropic support for education. The group provides \$10,000 in bursaries each year to the LGH nurses, to further their education in the field of nursing. As well, since 1971, they give 10 bursaries of \$500 to students at the John Abbott Nursing School.

Since 1965, the organization has given over \$2 million to the Lakeshore General Hospital for equipment and capital projects.

We would like to thank The Lakeshore General Hospital Auxiliaries for their volunteering efforts, and their contributions to the collective success in improving health care in our community. We wish them the best of luck in their future endeavours.
